Group 1:

F

1. I hear singing and there's no one there,

C7

I smell blossoms, and the trees are bare.

All day long, I seem to walk on air, I wonder why? I wonder why?

F7

Bb

I keep tossing in my sleep at night and what's more, I've lost my appetite

Gm

F

Stars that used to twinkle in the skies

Gm

F

Are twinkling in my eyes - I wonder why

Group 2:

F

2. You don't need analyzing; it's not so sur-pri-sing

C7

That you feel very strange, but nice - your heart goes pitter-patter

F

I know just what's the matter, because I've been there once or twice

Put your head on my shoulder, you need someone who's older,

F7 Bb

A rubdown with a velvet glove.

Gm

F

There is nothing you can take to relieve that pleasant ache

Gm

F

You're not sick you're just in love

Repeat the above but both sung simultaneously.

Repeat again but Group 1 sings Verse 2 & Group 2 sings Verse 1

All: Gm C7 F
