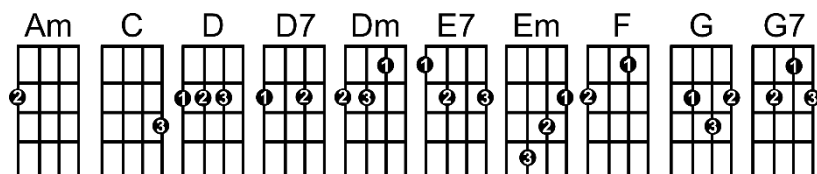


MORNING HAS BROKEN - Eleanor Farjeon/ 'Buinessan' 1931
