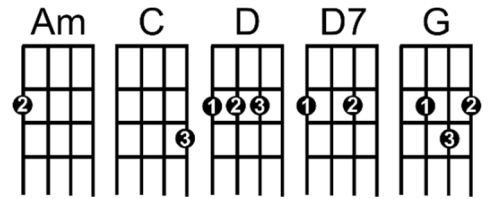


## **FOUR STRONG WINDS** - Ian Tyson 1963

*Intro - 1st 3 lines of chorus but lose last D7:*

*[G] - [Am] - [D7] - [G]  
[G] - [Am] - [D]*



1. Think I'll [G] go out to [Am] Alberta,  
Weather's [D7] good there in the [G] fall,  
I've got some friends that I can [Am] go to working [D] for. [D7]  
Still I [G] wish you'd change your [Am] mind,  
If I [D7] ask you one more [G] time,  
But we've [Am] been through that a [C] hundred times or [D] more. [D7]

### *Chorus:*

*Four strong [G] winds that blow [Am] lonely,  
Seven [D7] seas that run [G] high,  
All those things that don't [Am] change come what [D] may. [D7]  
But our [G] good times are all [Am] gone,  
And I'm [D7] bound for moving [G] on.  
I'll look [Am] for you, if I'm [C] ever back this [D] way.*

2. If I [G] get there before the [Am] snow flies,  
And if [D7] things are goin' [G] good,  
You could meet me if I [Am] send you down the [D] fare. [D7]  
But by [G] then it would be [Am] winter,  
Not too [D7] much for you to [G] do,  
And those [Am] winds sure can [C] blow cold way out [D] there. [D7]

### *Chorus*

3. *Instrumental – (1st 3 lines of 1st verse)*

*[G] - [Am]  
[D7] - [G]  
[G] - [Am] - [D] - [D7] then:*

Still [G] I wish you'd change your [Am] mind,  
If I [D7] ask you one more [G] time,  
But we've [Am] been through that a [C] hundred times or [D] more. [D7]  
*Chorus end on [G]*
