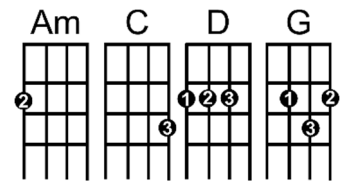


THE ROSE OF ALLENDALE – Jefferys / Nelson 1833



Intro: (last 2 lines of chorus) [G] [C] [G] [D] [G]
